Enhanced acoustic solutions were implemented, using soundproofing technologies to ensure confidential conversations remained private and minimize external noise distractions. Effective temperature management was achieved by using specially treated glass that reduces heat buildup, maintaining a comfortable working environment without excessive reliance on HVAC systems. prioritized by selecting tempered or laminated glass to prevent injuries in case of breakage, ensuring the design met safety standards. The glass office was seamlessly integrated into the surrounding workspace, using frames and finishes that aligned with the overall office aesthetic.

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were selected for their durability and safety features.
